Setting, materials, and preparation	Materials: Letter to parents explaining the principles of the book swap Organize a central area in the classroom Setting: classrooms
Step -by-step description	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Children bring in a book that they no longer read at home. 2. They talk about the book and why they enjoyed it. They outline the plot. 3. Books are displayed in a central area. 4. Children choose a book to take away.
Suggested follow-up actions/ activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In pairs, children could discuss the book that they had swapped and compare views. Children could write a short book review to place in the classroom.
